II. SCHOLARSHIP & OPPORTUNITIES (Seniors Only)

THE UNITED STATES PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLAR PROGRAM

The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) is seeking nominations for the <u>U.S. Presidential Scholars Program</u>. This is not a scholarship; however, all scholars will be honored for their accomplishments during the National Recognition Program, held in June in Washington, D.C.

Presidential Scholars will be guests of the commissioner of the U.S. Department of Education during the National Recognition Program and enjoy an expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C., to meet with government officials, educators and other accomplished people. To commemorate their achievement, the scholars are awarded the U.S. Presidential Scholars medallion at a ceremony sponsored by the White House.

Each school may nominate two high school seniors: **one male and one female.** Educators are being encouraged to nominate students who, while demonstrating outstanding scholarship, might not otherwise be nominated through the current ACT/SAT or arts recognition processes.

In addition to the general nominations, KDE is asking each school to nominate additional students to be included as candidates for excellence in career and technical education.

It may be helpful to consider the following questions:

- What about the student makes him or her stand out as having outstanding scholarship?
- What special challenges or hurdles has this student overcome while still achieving success in academics, technical education or in the arts?

Students who apply should complete the first page of the application form. The form must be downloaded before it can be completed. The second page must be completed by a counselor or teacher who is most familiar with the student.

For the **general component** of the program, students who meet the following criteria:

- are or will be U.S. citizens or Legal Permanent U.S. Residents by the application deadline (Students who were not U.S. citizens or Legal Permanent U.S. Residents on the day they took SAT or ACT exam, or who requested that The College Board or ACT not release their scores to outside entities, should contact the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program at 507-931-8345 to ensure their scores are considered in the determination of the candidate pool.);
- graduate or receive a diploma between January and August of 2021, the current program year; and
- score exceptionally well on either the SAT of the College Board or the ACT of the American College Testing Program, based on
 tests taken during the four-year window that begins in September, 2016 and runs through October, 2020, (for the recognition
 cycle concluding in June, 2021), nominated by their Chief State School Officer (CSSO) or nominated by one of our partner
 recognition organizations based on outstanding scholarship.

For the CTE component of the program, students who meet the following criteria:

- are or will be U.S. citizens or Legal Permanent U.S. Residents by the application deadline;
- graduate or receive a diploma between January and August of 2021, the current program year;
- demonstrate academic achievement in career and technical programs; and
- are nominated by their state's Chief State School Officer.

If you wish to be nominated for the Presidential Scholar Program or the Excellence in Career and Technical Education Program, please complete the following:

- 1. Page 1 of the application (see in Google Class of 2021)
- 2. Presidential Scholar Applicants Only: Answer the following questions with specific examples and vibrant details 1.) How have you demonstrated leadership in your life? 2.) How have you demonstrated character in your life? Manual can nominate only one male and one female for this program.
- 3. Excellence in Career and Technical Applicants Only: Answer the following questions with specific examples and vibrant details 1.) Discuss in detail your CTE capabilities. 2.) If applicable, describe any outstanding scholarship or demonstrated ability and accomplish in career and technical education fields. Manual can nominate several students for this program.

The application (page 1 only) and your Presidential Scholar answers or Career and Technical answers must be submitted to Mr. Fowler by 2:30 pm on Friday, October 23. (kevin.fowler@jefferson.kyschools.us).

THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA OUT-OF-STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Out-of-State Merit Scholarships for Fall 2021

STEP 1: Complete the Competitive Scholarship Application

For priority consideration for competitively awarded scholarships, entering freshman must be admitted **before January 15** of their senior year in high school and submit a completed scholarship application online.

To complete the scholarship application,

Go to myBama

Log in and click the Admissions/Scholarships link from the main menu

Then select the Application for Scholarships link within the Scholarships section of the page.

If you need help completing the scholarship application, please refer to the step-by-step instructions.

The University of Alabama will utilize the Competitive Academic Scholarship Review Scale listed below to alleviate the stress surrounding entrance exam testing availability by awarding comparable scholarship values to only the top applicants in the scholarship application pool.

The value of the UA Competitive Academic Scholarship will be based on the student's **CORE GPA** (defined as the average weighted GPA of core math, science, English, social studies, and foreign language classes) and ranking of the **TOP** scholarship applications in the application pool. All students that submit a competitive scholarship application will be reviewed for scholarships on both the <u>Automatic Merit</u> and the <u>Competitive Academic Scales</u>. Any student that receives an automatic merit scholarship that is later selected for a competitive academic scholarship of higher value will be upgraded to the UA Competitive Academic Scholarship and its value.

Students cannot receive both an Automatic Merit Scholarship and a UA Competitive Academic Scholarship. However, ALL students are strongly encouraged to fill out the scholarship application as this application also qualifies students for additional scholarship dollars that are stackable with either the Automatic Merit or Competitive Academic Scholarship.

When a student submits the scholarship application, it is disseminated to all awarding departments across campus including the National Alumni Association and the academic college that house the student's major (e.g., Arts and science, Business, etc.) for competitive scholarship consideration. Students are not responsible for submitting numerous applications to different departments.

By completing the scholarship application, students may apply for the National Alumni Association's <u>Competitive Alumni Scholarships</u> which require no previous affiliation with UA. The Alumni Association also offers the <u>Alumni Heritage Scholarship</u> and the <u>Alumni Scholar Award</u> to children and grandchildren of UA degree holders who are members of the National Alumni Association.

Once a scholarship application has been submitted, changes cannot be made to the application. All changes must be submitted to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions and Scholarships using the Contact Form.

Students that submit a scholarship application by our January 15 priority deadline can expect to receive notification of any competitive scholarships awarded, which includes the UA Competitive Academic Scholarship, by the first week of March.

If the January 15 priority deadline has passed, we still encourage students to complete the competitive scholarship application as we will continue to review applications on a fund available basis. The last day to submit a competitive scholarship application is March 1. Students that submit a scholarship application after the January 15 priority deadline can expect to receive notification of any competitive scholarships awarded by May 1.

STEP 2: Qualify For An Automatic Merit Scholarship

First-time freshmen admitted **before May 1**, have a qualifying composite score on the ACT or total score on the SAT by the end of February, and have at least a 3.0 cumulative high school GPA through December of the senior year will be eligible for the following automatic merit-based scholarships:

Presidential Elite Scholar

A student with a 4.0 GPA and a 36 ACT or 1600 SAT will be selected as a Presidential Elite Scholar and will receive:

Value of tuition for up to four years for degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate or law studies

One year of on-campus housing at regular room rate

\$1,000 per year stipend for four years

\$2,000 one-time allowance for use in summer research or international study (after completing one year of study at UA)

\$2,000 book scholarship (\$500 per year for four years)

Please note, if a student should meet the criteria for more than one merit scholarship, they will only be awarded the higher scholarship package.

A Note about Test Scores

The optional writing section on the SAT is not required for admissions or scholarship purposes.

The writing section of the ACT is not required for admissions or scholarship purposes.

- *For scholarships awarded only by Undergraduate Admissions If tuition is being paid by an outside source, the scholarship dollars may be used for other educational expenses (room, board, books, etc.).
- **Merit scholarships are typically awarded for a regular academic year which includes fall and spring semesters only (ie. 8 semesters over the course of four years). Merit scholarship awards will not exceed a semester's tuition.

STEP 3: Complete Your FAFSA (Optional)






My name is Emily Ye and I am the Program Coordinator at Asia America Career Connection Corp.

Allow me to start off with a brief introduction to AACC. Our programs provide students with opportunities to shadow physicians from a variety of departments at several of China's top teaching hospitals. Since 2016, we have worked with students from around the world and have worked with several universities to develop specialized programs that are tailored to their specific needs. More recently, AACC has recently expanded to also offer an online program given the global pandemic. Through these curated experiences, AACC students explore a diverse array of medical practices and learn about the intricacies of the Chinese health care system.

As the COVID pandemic continues to bring about new challenges, medical and public health professionals are confronting these from their position on the frontlines.
