### **BOSTON COLLEGE UPDATES**

#### **Test-Optional Policy Extended to the Class of 2026**

Boston College will remain <u>test-optional</u> for first-year (and now transfer) applicants during the 2021-22 admission cycle due to our concerns for student safety and an uncertain testing landscape related to the COVID-19 global pandemic.

By setting this policy early in the calendar year, we hope it will be helpful to you as you advise your juniors in the weeks ahead. This year, 42% of our applicants applied as test-submitters. We expect that when the Class of 2025 is finalized at the end of the cycle, we will find a similar percentage among our enrolled students.

Thank you for all you do in support of students, especially during these unprecedented times. We know that you must make professional and personal sacrifices each day and we commend you for your efforts. We will send another email in March to update you on the results of our Regular Decision round. In the meantime, best wishes to you and your students in the weeks ahead.

# KHEAA HELPS KENTUCKIANS PAY FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

Kentuckians seeking help to pay for college or technical training can take advantage of student aid programs administered by KHEAA.

"Every Kentuckian should be able to pursue higher education or technical training after high school, without financial barriers holding them back," Gov. Andy Beshear said. "I encourage students to take advantage of KHEAA's financial aid programs that make college and vocational classes possible for so many of our students."

#### KHEAA programs include the:

- · Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship. KEES lets high school students earn money by getting good grades in school and doing well on the ACT or SAT.
- · College Access Program Grant. CAP awards help financially needy students pay for classes at Kentucky's public and private two- and four-year colleges.
- · Kentucky Tuition Grant. Students enrolled full time in associate's and bachelor's degree programs at the state's private colleges may be eligible for a KTG award.
- · Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship. The WRKS helps Kentuckians who have not yet earned an associate's degree afford an industry recognized certificate, diploma or AAS degree.

# KENTUCKY RISING JUNIOR MAY WIN SCHOLARSHIP, PHOTO SHOOT

A rising junior at one of Kentucky's public or private high schools will win a \$500 scholarship and a photo shoot

at their school through KHEAA's "Promote Your School" scholarship contest.

"The 'Promote Your School' scholarship contest gives students an opportunity to inspire others and showcase the true value of education in their community," Gov. Andy Beshear said. "In addition to receiving scholarship money, the winner will also get to see themselves and their classmates featured in KHEAA publications that are distributed to all the high schools across in the commonwealth."

The school must participate in the Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) program for a student to be eligible to enter. To be considered for the scholarship, students must submit an essay addressing one of these subjects:

- How I will inspire others to do better.
- How education makes a community stronger.

The essay must be no more than 200 words in length and cannot mention the student's name, school, county or community. The essay should not identify the student by race, gender, religion or other manner. Essays in excess of 200 words or ones that include identifying information will be disqualified.

The essay topic must be shown at the top of the page. The student's name, address and high school must be listed at the bottom of the essay. The student must be a high school junior during the 2021–2022 school year, so entrants must be high school sophomores this spring. For contest details, visit kheaa.com/website/contest/rules.

Photos from the winning school will be used in KHEAA publications and on KHEAA websites.

To enter, mail your essay to KHEAA Publications, P.O. Box 798, Frankfort, KY 40602. You may also email your essay to publications@kheaa.com. The winner will be chosen

by a committee of KHEAA employees. The deadline for submissions is May 31.

The scholarship funds will be sent to the winner's school when he or she enters college as a freshman.

Students from high schools that have won in the past five years — Bullitt East, Warren East, Paducah St. Mary, Logan County and Daviess County — are not eligible to enter this year's contest.

# UPDATES FROM WILLIAMS COLLEGE

#### **Extending Our Test-Optional Admission Pilot**

In response to ongoing public health concerns, and so that we can take the most thoughtful approach to assessing the impact of this year's test-optional policy, our pilot has been extended for two additional years. All students applying for entry in fall 2021, 2022, or 2023 may choose whether to submit SAT/ACT exam results. This policy applies to all applicants—first-year and transfer, domestic and international, those studying in a school-based setting or homeschooled. Regardless, they will be evaluated through a student-centered, holistic evaluation process.

As you counsel students interested in Williams, it may be helpful to know that during Early Decision, 46% of applicants and 43% of admitted students did not submit the SAT/ACT. Among Regular Decision applicants, 48% have applied without testing. We are still in the early stages of Regular Decision review, but I look forward to sharing additional data about the profile of admitted students this summer. In the meantime, please know that testing is *truly* optional.

#### **Exploring Williams Virtually**

Our campus remains closed to visitors until further notice, but there are many ways to explore Williams from afar. Over the next few months students and families can connect with us via:

- A series of topic-specific <u>virtual open houses</u>
- Weekly information sessions
- Informal **Eph Chats** with current students
- Our virtual tour

And while we're eager to get to know your students, we know that for many, there's simply no time or bandwidth for even one more moment on Zoom. We get it. Believe me, we get it! Please note that Williams doesn't track or use demonstrated interest in any way. If students find it helpful to connect, we can't wait to meet them. If not, we look forward to getting to know them through the application process in the months ahead.

#### **Expanding Our Free Summer Initiative**

All students receiving financial aid can now choose any <u>two</u> summers during their Williams career when their summer earnings contribution will be replaced by additional grant funding from Williams. Our hope is that this initiative will allow students to consider opportunities they otherwise couldn't—unpaid internships, research fellowships, passion projects, and self-care—but their plans need not meet any specific requirements to benefit from the additional funding. The Free Summers are theirs to use, with no questions asked.

While I'm thrilled to share these updates with you, I also know they address just a tiny portion of the enormous challenges your students face right now. We remain committed to constantly re-examining our practices for ways to improve and better serve all students. Thanks, as always, for your partnership in that work.

# FEDERAL STUDENT AID CAN HELP PAY COLLEGE COSTS

The federal government offers many financial aid programs to help students and families pay for college. Applying for those programs means submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, usually called the FAFSA.

"Kentuckians should know all the options they have for assistance in continuing their education. The federal government is the primary source of financial aid for students in either the technical or academic fields," Gov. Andy Beshear said. "All Kentuckians pursuing education after high school should file the FAFSA so they can take advantage of any federal grants for which they may qualify and, if necessary, secure federal student loans."

These brief summaries describe the more common federal grant and loan programs. Grants generally do not have to be repaid, but loans do. More about these programs can be found at studentaid.gov.

- **Federal Pell Grant:** Pell Grants provide up to \$6,345 per year for undergraduates with financial need. That amount is expected to increase for the 2021–22 school year.
- **Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant:** These grants provide up to \$4,000 per year for undergraduate students who have exceptional financial need.
- **Direct** Loans: These loans are available to undergraduate, graduate and professional students. The amount students can borrow depends on their year in school.
- **Federal PLUS Loans:** Parents of dependent undergraduate students may qualify for PLUS Loans, depending on the parents' credit ratings. The amount available depends on how much other financial aid the student receives. Graduate and professional students may apply for PLUS Loans if they have exhausted their Direct Loan eligibility.

### JOBCORPS UPDATES

We are very excited to say that while not all Jobcorps centers are opening at present, our center in Simpsonville, Whitney M Young, is open! We are currently phasing in current students in groups and then will move on to new students. We hope to have new students starting in the next month or two. Since the application can take three to four weeks to complete, this would be an excellent time for students to begin the Jobcorps application process if they are interested! # <u>FIRST~TIME FEDERAL STUDENT LOAN BORROWERS MUST TAKE ENTRANCE</u> COUNSELING

Kentuckians who will borrow money for college using federal student loans must complete entrance counseling if they are borrowing for the first time.

"Entrance counseling will help students understand

the financial commitments they're agreeing to when

they receive their loan," said Gov. Andy Beshear. "Fully understanding these financial obligations is an important step if you're taking out federal student loans to help pay for education after high school. I'm glad our students now have this resource to learn more early in the process."

The U.S. Department of Education requires borrowers to complete the counseling before students will receive loan funds. The counseling will teach users how to borrow responsibly so they don't take out more loans than they need.

The department offers online counseling at **studentaid.gov** under the Complete Aid Process tab. The counseling should take between 20 to 30 minutes. Borrowers should check with their college to see if the federal counseling session is accepted as some schools have alternate counseling program requirements.
